Preparations are being completed this week for the flight training course and ground school to be offered by the University of Minnesota, Morris beginning Tuesday, February 6.

These two courses are among six being offered at UMI on Tuesday evenings starting on that date. Art, history, library science and sumic courses will also be svallable.

Under instructor Donald Thlumberg of the University of Minnesota Flight
Facility, the ground and flight schools will meet for three hours at 7:30 p.m.
each Taxaday for 12 weeks.

Primary objective of the progress is to prepare abudents to pass the private pilot written exemination. For this reason many residents of the Morris area may wish to register in the ground school only without taking flight training. Cost of the ground school slope is \$30. Flight training, including dual and solo flying, and ground school combined will post \$175.

The ground school course will cover air navigation, radio aids, meteorology, flight theory and analysis of flight unneavers, aircraft and engine operation, civil air regulations, aircraft instruments and other subjects pertaining to the safe, officient and economical operation of aircraft.

After ground school is undersay students also enrolled in flight training will begin dual flying instruction under Mr. Unleaberg. An airplane will be formished by the University Plight Pacility.

Registration will be made in each course at the time of the first meeting

February 6. Flight training is limited to a maximum of 10 students but ground school will require a minimum enrollment of 20 students. High school graduation is not a requirement for either course.
