EDITOR'S NOTE: Here is another in the series "This Week at UMM," a continuing preview of events on the Minnesota-Morris campus of interest to the public.

MORRIS (2/27/76) -- A UMM Theatre production, District 21 State High School Basketball playoffs, two concerts and a convocation on biofeedback, yoga and therapy are among upcoming events at the University of Minnesota, Morris.

Wednesday (3/3) through Saturday (3/6) theatre-goers will be treated to the popular 19th century play, "Under the Gaslight," by Augustin Daly presented by the UMM players in Proscenium Theatre of the Humanities Fine Arts Center. Curtain time is 8:15 p.m. for the performances, and admission is \$1 for students and \$1.50 general admission. Tickets may be reserved by calling 589-3380 or 589-2211 ext. 399 during box office hours, 9:30 to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Thursday (3/4) and Friday (3/5) District 21 State High School basketball tournaments will be held in the UMM P.E. Center. Admission each evening is 50 cents for students, \$2 for adults and \$2.50 for reserved adult tickets.

Sunday (3/7) the UMM Orchestra, University Choir, Madrigal Singers and Men's Chorus, under the direction of Ralph Williams, will combine for a 3 p.m. Edson Hall concert. The program ranges from works by Mozart, Beethoven, Brahms, and other classical composers to folk songs, madrigals, and spirituals and is free and open to the public.

Monday (3/8) a convocation on "Biofeedback, Yoga and Therapy," featuring psychologist Phil Nuernberger will be held at 4 p.m. in Edson. The convocation is free and open to the public.

Tuesday (3/9) the UMM Concert Band and Stage Band will present an 8:15 p.m. concert in Recital Hall of the Humanities Fine Arts Center. The concert will include works by Gustav Holst, Vincent Persichetti and W.A. Mozart, as well as a glance into the past with a number of selections from the Dixieland tradition. It is free and open to the public.
