MORRIS (3/24/76) -- A gallery opening, a concert and convocations on rape and human consciousness are among upcoming events at the University of Minnesota, Morris..

Photographs by Michael Catlin and the UMM Permanent Art Collection will be on display in the Humanities Fine Arts Center Gallery March 30 through April 23.

The gallery opening at 4 p.m. Tuesday (3/30) is open to the public without charge. Gallery hours for the exhibit are 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Saturday, (4/3) "Without Consent: A Convocation on Rape," will be held in Recital Hall of the Humanities Fine Arts Center from 8:30 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. The convocation is presented by the Minnesota Program for Victims of Sexual Assault.

Topics to be covered include myths and facts about rape, emotional problems and needs of the victim and legal and medical procedures. The convocation is sponsored by the Third Ear Counseling Service, the UMM Office of Residential Life, the Morris Campus Union Board and the Women's Collective.

Also slated Saturday (4/3) is a concert by James Lee Stanley in Edson Auditorium at 9:00 p.m. Stanley, a guitarist, lyricist and pianist, has been described as having "the uncanny knack of being able to paint a song, using words and lyrics with ease to create striking images of places, feelings, people and relationships." The concert is free and open to the public.

Hypnosis, consciousness and suggestion will be examined in the Convocations in Human Consciousness series April 4 through 10.

Sunday (4/4) "Hypnotic Explorations of Self" will be the topic of Fred Hack, a practicing hypnotist, at 4 p.m. in Edson. Hack is associated with the Gnostica Bookstore in Minneapolis.

A film presentation on "Hypnotic Behavior" will be presented Monday (4/5) and Tuesday (4/6) at 7 p.m. in Edson Auditorium.

Wednesday (4/7) "Hypnotic Behavior and Suggestability," featuring Dr. Auke Tellegen, will be presented in Edson at 4 p.m. Dr. Tellegen is a psychologist at the University of Minnesota, who has been involved in the scientific study of hypnosis.

All of the events sponsored under the "Convocations in Human Consciousness" series are free and open to the public.
