EDITOR'S NOTE: Here is another in the series "This Week at UMM," a continuing preview of events of interest to the public on the Minnesota, Morris campus.

MORRIS (4/16/76) — Films, District 21 High School Music Contests, a student recital, two theatre productions and a Children's Ice Cream and Lollipop art show and AAU wrestling are among upcoming events at the University of Minnesota, Morris in the days ahead.

"Film Making Minnesota-Style," sponsored under the UMM convocation series, is slated Wednesday (4/21) and Thursday (4/22). Wednesday (4/21) "Loose Ends," a film depicting the story of working class frustration and the struggle to escape the routine of life, will be shown at 8:15 p.m. in Edson Auditorium.

Albert Milgram, who assisted in producing "Loose Ends," will comment on some of the aspects involved in making and producing the film. It was shot in St. Paul. Milgram is director of the University Film Society.

Thursday (4/22) a second film, "Warm in the Bud," will be shown at 3 p.m. in Edson. This film, shot in Edina, has a European flavor and was presented in the 1971 Cannes Film Festival Critics Week.

Both films are free and open to the public.

District 21 High School Music Contests for large groups will be held in the UMM Humanities Fine Arts Center Saturday (4/24). The P.E. Center will be the site of AAU wrestling, also on Saturday (4/24).

Sunday (4/25) UMM senior Colin Chisholm will present a vocal recital in Recital Hall of the Humanities Fine Arts Center at 3 p.m. It is free and open to the public.

An exhibit entitled "Western Minnesota Architecture from 1870 to 1900" will open in the Humanities Fine Arts Center Gallery at 7 p.m., Tuesday (4/27). The exhibition is free and open to the public. It includes more than 100 photographs of nineteenth century buildings in Stearns, Pope, Stevens, Grant, Douglas, Big Stone Otter Tail and Traverse Counties, as well as paintings and drawings of rural architecture by contemporary Minnesota Artists.

Fred W. Peterson, UMM Art faculty member and gallery coordinator, will present a gallery talk, and refreshments will be served. The exhibition will continue through May 15 with gallery hours 9 a.m. through 8 p.m. Monday through Friday, and Saturday and Sunday from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Monday (4/26), the New Shakespeare Company of San Francisco will present "Hamlet" in Edson Auditorium at 8:15 p.m. Sponsored under the UMM Performing Arts Series, the production is "designed to tell the story that Shakespeare told so clearly and so simply and entertainingly

that people who never hear of Shakespeare will enjoy the man's magic," according to producer Clarence Ricklefs.

Admission is \$2 for those not holding subscriptions to the Performing Arts Series.

Also on Tuesday (4/27) the annual Ice Cream and Lollipops Arts Show, featuring art work by children of pre-school age through second grade, will be held in Edson Lounge. The show, sponsored by the UMM Women's Association, will continue through Friday.

Wednesday (4/28) the UMM Theatre production of "Yankee Doodle Comes to Town," a children's play by Martha Bennett King will open in Proscenium Theatre of the Humanities Fine Arts Center.

Matinee performances on Wednesday (4/28) Thursday (4/29) and Friday (4/30) have been reserved for area school children. Public performances will be given Friday (4/30) and Saturday (5/1) evenings at 7:15 p.m. Admissions is 50 cents for children of all ages and there will be no reserved tickets.
