EDITOR'S NOTE: Here is another in the weekly series, "This Week at UMM," a continuing preview during the school year of events on the Minnesota-Morris campus of interest to the public.

MORRIS -- The May meeting of the University of Minnesota Board of Regents, performances by the Minnesota Dance Theatre, Intercultural Emphasis Week and the UMM Theatre production "Happy Birthday Wanda June" are among upcoming events at the University of Minnesota, Morris.

Thursday (5/13) the University Board of Regents will arrive on campus to begin committee meetings at 1:15 p.m. in the Humanities Fine Arts Center.

Friday (5/14) morning the board will meet. At noon, a box luncheon picnic will be held on campus to provide an opportunity for everyone to meet and talk to the Regents on an informal basis. Box lunches will be available at \$1.75 each.

Also on Friday the Minnesota Dance Theatre will arrive for a two day residency that will include the premiere performance of "Carmina Burana" choreographed by Mrs. Loyce Houlton, artistic director for the theatre. The concert will be held at 8:15 p.m. in the Proscenium Theatre of the Humanities Fine Arts Center.

Saturday (5/15) the Dance Theatre will present a workshop at 10 a.m. in the P.E. Annex for interested persons. It is free and open to the public.

A second performance of "Carmina Burana" will be presented at 8:15 p.m. Saturday in Proscenium Theatre of the Humanities Fine Arts Center. Both concerts are sponsored under aegis of the UMM Performing Arts Series and admission is \$2 for non-students and those not holding series subscriptions.

Sunday (5/16) a film "The Third Man," starring Orson Welles and Joseph Cotton, will be shown at 8:15 p.m. in Edson Auditorium. The film is a mystery classic set in post World War II Vienna. It is free and open to the public.

Monday (5/17) will mark the beginning of Intercultural Emphasis Week. Activities will begin with travel films to be shown from 10 a.m. to noon Monday (5/17 and Tuesday- (5/18).

At 7:30 p.m. Monday there will be an intercultural communication simulation game in Edson Lounge. It is free and open to the public.

Tuesday (5/18) "Higher Education in Germany" will be the topic of a talk by UMM faculty member Eric Klinger, who recently spent a sabbatical leave in Germany. The 3:30 p.m. talk is free and open to the public.

At 7 p.m. the UMM Foreign Language Club will present folk dancing on the mall.

Also on Tuesday the UMM Concert Band will present a concert by American composers at 8:15 p.m. in the Fine Arts Recital Hall. It is free and open to the public.

Tuesday, (5/18) the Morris Minnesota International Students Association (MO-MISA) will launch an international festival in Edson Lounge. Included will be samples of foreign foods, music and dress. It is open to all, and admission is complementary.

Slated Wednesday is the opening of the UMM Theatre production "Happy Birthday Wanda June." Curtain time is 8:15 for the Kurt Vonnegut satire, which will run through Saturday (5/22). Admission is \$1 for students and \$1.50 for non-students.
