UMM SUMMER SESSION FILM SERIES SCHEDULED

Five countries will be represented in the film series scheduled for the University of Minnesota, Morris summer session beginning in June. One film will be shown each Wednesday during the five-week summer session. There will be no charge to summer students.

The brilliant French film, "Hiroshima, Mon Amour," made in 1959, will open the summer film series on June 13. Scheduled for June 20 is "Picnic," William Inge's Pulitzer Prize-winning play of small town Americans. Starring William Holden, Rosalind Russell and Kim Novak, the film won two Academy Awards in 1955.

Swedish director Ingmar Bergman's circus drama, "Sawdust and Tinsel," will be shown on June 27. Vittorio de Sica's award-winning film, "The Bicycle Thief," is scheduled on July 5. Concluding the series on July 11 will be a documentary, "China's 400 Million," an unforgettable epic of the struggle of the Chinese people against Japanese aggression. It is narrated by Frederic March.

The UMM summer session will open on June 11 with classes meeting every weekday through July 13. Twelve courses in eight fields will be available this summer including courses in American literature, art, anthropology, geology, history, humanities, mathematics and sociology.
