Summer session faculty at the University of Minnesota, Morris was announced this week by Charles C. Hanna, coordinator of the summer program which begins Monday, June 11. The inaugural summer college courses at UMM are aimed at teachers of the area as well as present or former college students and high school graduates who wish to begin their college education at this time.

Of particular interest to teachers is the fact that since UMM is a college of the University of Minnesota, credits earned during the summer session are accepted by the Minnesota Department of Education for purposes of the renewal of certificates or for earning additional credits to validate teaching assignments in specific areas.

Two art courses will be taught by Dr. Frederick W. Peterson, assistant professor of art at UMM. A graduate of St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota, Dr. Peterson received his doctoral degree from the University of Minnesota. He will teach a survey course in the history of European and American art from 1425 to 1960 and a course in drawing and design.

W. D. Spring, lecturer in English at UMM, will teach American Literature II and a humanities course, offered for either upper or lower division credit. Mr. Spring received the Bachelor of Philosophy and Master of Arts degrees from Marquette University, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and is presently completing work on his doctoral dissertation.

An instructor in mathematics at UMM, Sen Fan, will conduct courses in higher algebra and introductory statistics. Mr. Fan received his Bachelor of Science degree at Taiwan Normal University in Formosa and the Master of Science degree at the University of Illinois at Champaign.

(UMM SUMMER SCHOOL continued)

Two American history courses--one covering the period from 1607 to 1840 and a second covering the development of the South between 1840 and 1890--will be taught by Dr. John Q. Imholte, assistant professor of history. A graduate of Washington and Lee University, Lexington, Virginia, Dr. Imholte received his masters and doctoral degrees from the University of Minnesota.

An anthropology course and a sociology course--Theories of Criminal and Delinquent Behavior--will be taught by Bruce A. Nord, instructor in sociology at UMM. Mr. Nord is a graduate of the University of Minnesota.

Howard L. Stensrud, instructor in geology, will conduct a five-credit course, Earth Features and Their Meaning, which provides a general study of the earth's crust. A graduate of the University of Minnesota, Mr. Stensrud received his master of arts degree from the University of Wyoming at Laramie. With the exception of geology, the summer session courses are all three-credit courses.
