MORRIS--The University of Minnesota, Morris Cougars will open their 1963 home football schedule this Saturday, September 28 against North Dakota State School of Science at Miller Field. Game time is 8 p.m.

Thus far this season, Coach Borstad has had to use his first team both on offense and defense. The second team has seen only limited action on defense. However, there have been some impressive showings by some of the second-team players and they will be seeing more action during the remainder of the season.

Assistant Coach Noel Olson and Athletic Director Bruce Olson were scouting North Dakota State School of Science over the weekend. Right now, this is the team which has developed into one of the Cougars biggest rivals. Last year they defeated the Cougars, but only after a long, hard battle.

The Cougars will be at home for three games in a row. North Dakota State School of Science this Saturday, Sioux Falls College on October 5 and Minot State College on the 12th of October.

The 19th of October the Cougar travel to Bethel for the first of two conference games. The team from Northland College will be in Morris on October 26, Dad's Day, and the Cougars finish the season on the road, against Ellendale State College on November 2.

The Sioux Falls College game is Homecoming and will be played at 2 p.m. in the afternoon. The other three home games are at 8 p.m.

Season tickets for the home schedule will be on sale at the gate Saturday evening, Bruce Rolloff, Athletic Director, has announced. The price for individual games is \$1.50 for adults. Visiting college students will be charged \$1.00, highschool students \$.75 and children under 12, \$.50.
