Newest bulletin of the University of Minnesota, Morris, has been published and is now available, according to Dean Rodney A. Briggs. The 72-page bulletin outlines the programs and courses available at UMM, summarizes general information about the college and lists the admission and graduation requirements now in effect as UMM becomes a four-year liberal arts college this fall.

The bulletin is being distributed to highschools and colleges throughout the state and to prospective students and other interested persons upon request.

Courses of instruction as listed in the bulletin are available in 24 fields including anthropology, art, biology, chemistry, economics and business, education, engineering graphics, English, French, geography, geology, German, History, humanities, mathematics, music, philosophy, physical education, physics, political science, psychology, sociology, Spanish and speech.

As stated in the bulletin, the University of Minnesota, Morris offers two academic programs: a four-year liberal arts curriculum and preprofessional training of one to four years' duration.

Requirements for prospective majors or minors in 18 fields of concentration are detailed in the bulletin. A strong program is being provided at UMM in areas where the interest of the largest number of students is expected. Noteworthy changes are found in the expansion of the curriculum

in languages, speech and theater arts and philosophy, as well as in the addition of an elementary education program.

Preprofessional training in more than 20 areas is outlined in the catalog. Special courses have been added to insure the transfer of qualified students to the professional schools on the University's Minneapolis and St. Paul campuses or at other institutions.

Preprofessional sequences are available at UMM in law, engineering, journalism, architecture, business administration, dentistry, medicine, nursing, medical technology, physical therapy, occupational therapy, pharmacy, veterinary medicine, home economics, recreational leadership, forestry, wildlife management, and several agricultural specialties.
