MORRIS -- A graduate level course, Supervision of Student Teaching, will be offered by the Morris General Extension Center, it was announced Wednesday by Charles Hanna, Co-ordinator for the center at the University of Minnesota, Morris.

The course will be held on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 4:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., beginning September 24. Registration will be held from 4 to 4:30 p.m. on September 24. These two a week classes will continue through December 5.

The course will be taught by Dr. Louise Curtis, a new member of the UMM faculty. She is the former head of the elementary education division at Macalaster College in St. Paul and joined the UMM staff this year to teach several courses in the elementary education program.

The official authorization received from the Graduate School on the Minneapolis campus granted the appointment of Dr. Curtis to teach the course and verified that Graduate School credit would be given for this course, Education 184.

The course description for the course is as follows: For persons planning to supervise or administer student teaching and other professional laboratory experiences in elementary and secondary education. Tuition for this 3 credit course is \$30.

The new course has been scheduled at UMM so that area teachers can better prepare themselves for the supervision of student teachers from the University of Minnesota, Morris. This is the first year that student teachers have gone out from UMM.
