MORRIS-- "Diary of A County Priest" will be the first film in the 1963-64 University of Minnesota, Morris Fine Arts Film Series it was announced yesterday. The film will be shown Friday, September 27 at 8:00 p.m. in the Edison Hall auditorium on the UMM campus.

This French movie, based on the novel by Georges Bernanos, is directed by Robert Bresson. French dialog is used, and English sub-titles are provided. The movie has received numerous awards, including the Venice Film Festival Special Award and the Italian Film Critics' Prize for Best Foreign Film of the Year and was named One of the Ten Best Foreign Films of the Year by the National Board of Review.

The UMM Fine Arts Film Series will feature 15 movies in its program, five each quarter. Season tickets are being sold at the Business Office on campus, and will also be sold at the door Friday ~~and~~ night. Season tickets for non-students are \$7.50 each. The next film in the series will be shown on Friday, October 11.

Other films which have been ordered for this year's program are: "L'Avventura, The Seventh Seal, Viridians, Calle Mayor, Breathless, The Island, My Uncle, The Lady With The Dog, Earrings of Madame De.

"Calle Mayor", a Spanish film, tells the story of the prank the young men of a main street ("Calle Mayor") in some dusty, Spanish town play on a spinster of the town. They manufacture a romance for her, announce it publicly and finally tell the entire town that it was simply a hoax.

"The Lady With The Dog", a Russian movie, is adapted from Anton Chekhov's nostalgic short story of a love affair between a married bank official on holiday in Yalta and a beautiful young lady - also married - who is always accompanied by her white Pomeranian dog.

"The Earrings of Madame De" stars Danielle Darrieux, Charles Boyer and Vittorio De Sica. The merry-go-round of love is the ironic plot of the sophisticated, French, tragic-comedy.
