MORRIS--Five lovely University of Minnesota, Morris coeds are vying for the 1963 UMM Homecoming Crown which will be awarded tonight (Friday) at 8 p.m. in Edison Hall auditorium. A panel of students, faculty and Morris businessmen will select the queen during an interview session scheduled for 4 p.m. this afternoon. All campus elections were held yesterday narrowing the field of ten to the five now awaiting the interviews this afternoon. (At press time these five names were not available.)

Last night a bon fire and snake dance were held on the north parking lot of the the campus, followed by a mixer in Louie's Lower Level. After tonight's coronation ceremony there will be another student mixer in Louie's.

Tomorrow Queen ??? will reign over the Homecoming game between the UMM Cougars and the Braves of Sioux Falls College. Game time is 2 p.m. at Miller Field. Preceding Saturday's game, a car caravan will form on campus, move through the downtown business district and return to campus, beginning at 1:15 p.m. A prize is being offered for the best decorated car.

Saturday night the big Homecoming dance will be held in the gymnasium, beginning at 9 p.m. Music will be supplied by "The Collegiates," a group of 10 South Dakota State College students who have made many appearances in west central Minnesota.

As the final event of the Homecoming weekend, the UMM Concert Band will present a free concert at 3:30 p.m. Sunday afternoon in Edison Hall auditorium.
