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1. For Action: MSLC Constitution *presented by Rep. Forney*

 - b) PASSED**
2. For Information: Tuition Differential Resolution *presented by Rep. Tipper*
 - a) Was read last week at forum.
 - b) Is looking for input on the resolution as it will be voted on next week
 - c) Recommends taking out third 'whereas'.
 - d) Mitch: If we have questions, can we email you.
 - (1) President Wealot: Yes they can email you.
 - e) President wealot: the resolution basiclly says that we oppose the resolution, and don't like it, but we aren't giving any alternatives.
 - f) Else: In finance committee, they were talking about cutting programs and faculty, but this isn't really an option, but they are also talking about what they want raising the food cost on campus.
 - g) Edison: Called for a straw poll
 - (1) Result was split feelings
 - h) Kyle: while it is not the best option to raise the cost for one group, how many would be for raising the cost of coming to the school across the board? The money has to come from someplace. Some of the money would be going to pay for faculty salaries.

(b) Related to Kyle:

(ii) This differential is going to happen eventually, and can we really get the support that we need from the student body to get them to pay the extra

(6) Edison: If we do go the scholarship route, why not have fewer scholarships, but less money overall.

(c) Coco: As long as the tuition differential is small enough, it would still be cheaper.

- a) Tech Fee Licensing discussion *presented by Sec. Brockamp*
 - (1) We need the money because they state does not give us a lot of money to allocate.
 - (2) A proposal must be written, and must fall under the banner of technology.
 - (3) MCSA is responsible for allocating the money.

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(4) Last year, it was brought up that there are some software licensing that needs to be renewed

(a) People aren't sure whether or not this is something that need to be under the banner of tech fee, or if this only applies to new technology

b) Discussion

(1) Laddie: I was there for discussions last year, and I think that while you could make an argument that the initial investment might be too much, given the budgeting situation, not allowing the renewal of software that we agreed was important, we should renew the subscription.

(2) Sofia: What would be the alternate source of funding?

(a) President Wealot responds:

(4) How much money was actually spent on this,

(a) We have not gotten very far in unraveling all the expenses.

(b) \$19,000 dollars went to software, and \$10,000 went to subscription renewal

(a) President Wealot: that is what we are trying to figure out,

(b) If we don't have a subscription renewal, then we lose the subscription.

(i) Really, does it meet the tech fee peramoitiers

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- (d) There are a couple different ways to license software
 - (i) The Diction software is software where you have to buy different versions
 - (a) This is the old model
 - (ii) Now, companies are moving to subscription based models where you can only have the program for a certian period of time
 - (iii) There is also cloud service software.
 - (a) Zimride is one of these
 - (b) If you don't renew, you lose the clou
 - (6) Coco: Have these renewals kept us from buying something that we needed.
 - (a) President Wealot: We are also debating about the limited amount of funding that we have
 - (b) Laddie: It is really hard to say that, oh it would be nice to fund this, but we just can't do it. There were a couple things last year that swwe really wanted to fund, but we couldn't do it. Even without the software renewals, we still would not have been able to do it. If we cut off funding. ,we will never know the impact that it would have had.
 - (7) Since tech fee started, there has been a ban on recurring costs.
 - (8) Fiona: It is realistic if we don't fund them, we should keep the right to vote things down, and encorage them to fund themselves.
- c) Sofia: Should we actually say that we were able to offer the recurring subscriptions, would it be guaranteed every year?

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(1) President wealot: No, they would have to reapply every year.

d) Edison:

e) Mitch: In your opinion, what would the response of the school be if we were to say that we were not going to fund these; would the university find the money, or let them fail .

(1) They will scramble, because there is no magic pot of money to give.

f) Mitch: Do you think that the university would have the ability to shift the cost onto themselves eventually.

(1) It would be a case by case basis.

(2) So may find funding, but some might not.

(3) It is always possible to put in language that this would be renewed every year.

(4) It is helpful to put in who this would be helping.

(5) you might say that administrative software might not be as important to renew

g) Mitch: I think that we do need these programs, and it would end up having the programs cut if we don't fund them.

(1) There are a lot of benefits, but with the subscription based model, we have are able to have the latest version of the software.

h) Mitch: so there is an amendment proposed.

(1) President Wealot: no, that is what the discussion is about
