I. Open Forum

A. Listserv Conversation *presented by* Dave Swenson

- 1.** Dave Swenson - Sr. Director Student Activities, Health and Wellness
- 2.** *Provides listserv statistics handout*
- 3.** Listserv = sends out messages to a whole group from one address.
 - a)** UMMs is now opt-in, not opt-out. Changed in 2013
 - b)** Needed to change in accordance of FERPA
 - c)** Have used orientation to encourage students to opt-in
 - d)** Last year it has been used differently and students are frustrated by content. More students are opting out or are not paying attention to it
 - e)** What is a moderator: controls the time and place of emails, but cannot control/edit what people say due to Freedom of Speech.
 - f)** Under the Code of Conduct - “cannot harass individuals,” but this does not emphasize groups.
 - g)** No ability to edit content, can only approve or disapprove.
- 4.** *Swenson:* If this is no longer a viable tool, should it still exist? Is it still useful? Do students still need it?
 - a)** *Lenius:* We shouldn't consider removing a tool that is still used by 1300 students even if satisfaction is not there.
 - b)** *Gardner:* Use listserv for finding campus events when writing articles for UR
 - (1) *Swenson:* the listserv is the only “push” system we have on campus meaning it is the only system that sends info to students without them having to go out a find the information themselves (a “pull” system)

- c) *Schewe*: Thinking of alternatives, another way to advertise events is poster which is bad for the environment. There are other ways of communicating, but it requires more effort and the listserv is more passive. We still need it.
- d) *Ledermann*: In regards to percentage of students who have stopped using listserv, is it correct that student population has also gone down?
- (1) *Swenson*: Decrease in listserv usage has gone down greater than student enrollment. Fall of 2013, very close to actual student enrollment, but has continued to decline at rate higher than enrollment. Yes, there are a lot of students using it, but there is no way to measure how many students pay attention to the list who are actually on it.
- e) *Smith*: Do these numbers include graduated students?
- (1) *Swenson*: Each summer grads are removed.
- (2) *Smith* : Overall the listserv is good.
- f) *Millard*: Yes, just because there are 1300 students on it doesn't mean it has active usage due to sheer volume of messages.
- (1) *Swenson*: Generally between 40-60 messages per day
- (2) *Millard*: As a transfer student we had a similar option, but it was digest, so messages had to go in the night before and only one email was sent out the next day.
- (3) *Swenson*: Exploring what other schools are doing. No other U of M or MNSCU school has listserv like us. Also looking at some private schools who use a digest. On our current system there is a digest function, but after x pieces of info the digest will be sent out. Right now there is no way to control when that happens. So, also looking into other software packages.
- g) *Rasmussen*: How much money does the listserv cost?

- (1) *Swenson*: U of M owns the software, so the only cost is the amount of staff time it takes to review and approve. About 20 minutes a day.
- h)** *Alam*: Some people don't split their emails into separate categories.
- (1) *Swenson*: Gmail organizes email many ways
- (2) *Alam*: Maybe educate students how to organize their inboxes
- (3) *Swenson*: Teaching will be hard
- i)** *Hunt*: Have we looked at a wider area of distributing info that's not email. Like an IRC client?
- (1) *Swenson*: No have not looked into this. Right now meetings, events, roommates/leases, selling stuff (not textbooks), etc. go through the listserv. If we had separate listservs for each category people wouldn't subscribe. It would be nice to have something similar to Craigslist, but Morris is not large enough to merit own Craigslist location. That is also a "pull" model. Students have to go look for info. Still looking into what other schools are doing
- j)** *Gregg*: With less subscribers it is less effective, but the listserv follows the ideals of LA education because students are exposed to all things. It fosters community and leads to less grouping of people.
- k)** *Dice*: Doesn't like the listserv and it is not effective. Things that come up that interest her, but doesn't have time to go through all the events. One email/document would be easier to go through, better for advertising events, and more efficient. There could be different sections for each categories, so you would be able to look for what you needed. Sent to everyone, not just only those are opted in.
- l)** *Forum student visitor*: agree with Mckenzie, anyone who wants to send out emails would have to be efficient and timely to get into

the newsletter. Newsletter format would help groups that are uncomfortable from listserv feel less uncomfortable. Listserv is not effective as professional email source.

m) Swenson: Summary: The push model (convenient message) is still effective and should continue, but if there was a way to reduce number of emails and combine categories that would be more advantageous.

 - a) *Chancellor*: At my first day reception a lot of retirees came to meet me, but usually retirees don't come back to their old workplaces. Maybe it's due to the small town.
7. *Chancellor*: Will have open office hours this semester to see if people take advantage of them.
 - a) Meant to be opportunities to come talk to Chancellor about anything that's on your mind.
 - b) Also planning an open Chat with Chancellor Session. Want to be accessible as she can, but don't want to sit around if no one shows up.
 - c) Willing to chat with people in impromptu conversations if not busy. Door is literally and figuratively open.
 - d) All administration is here in service to students and this is your school. Committed to making sure this University is the best place it can be. Want it to be healthy, sustainable and to live out our times here.
